About Short+Sweet 2014

Short+Sweet (originally known as Short & Sweet) is a multi-form arts platform presenting festivals in theatre, dance, music-theatre, comedy and cabaret across Australia and Asia. Short+Sweet's vision statement is: a more creative world ten minutes at a time. The flagship festival is Short+Sweet Theatre Sydney, the largest ten-minute play festival in the world.

Short+Sweet Theatre was founded at the Newtown Theatre in Sydney, Australia in January 2002 by Mark Cleary, beginning with the first ever Short+Sweet Theatre festival. Festivals are now held across the globe. Short+Sweet Theatre Sydney is now the largest ten-minute theatre festival in the world, with around 180 new plays being produced every season.

There are many unique elements to this festival, some of which are, a strict time-limit, limit of one play per playwright, one play per director and two plays per actor, people's choice voting and the competitive aspect of the festival where plays are chosen from each week to progress to the Gala Finals.

Short+Sweet South India started as Short+Sweet Chennai in 2011. Since 2014, the festival has opened to entries from the four southern states in India. The jury members for the weeks are not known to the public, and consist of a good mix of connoisseurs from diverse fields.

The festival is presented in association with Blu Lotus Foundation and Alliance Francaise of Madras. The Australian Consulate General Chennai, Chennai Live and Goethe Institut supported this edition of the festival.

As a part of S+S 2014, the inaugural Crash Test Drama was conducted on 2nd May, 2014 at the Goethe Institut. 7 English plays and 2 Tamil plays were performed. Five scripts from the Crash Test made it to S+S Chennai 2014 and two of the new directors at the Crash Test directed plays in the festival.

We organized 3 workshops – Play-writing workshop by Ramu Ramanathan, The Actor & Space workshop by V. Balakrishnan and Acting, Voice & Stage-craft by Vinod Anand.

This edition, the festival featured nearly 50 plays. There were so many new artists that the Wild Cards category had to be extended into 2 days and 4 shows, instead of the regular 2 shows. This year again we had theatre groups from other cities – Bangalore, Pune, and Sydney. The audience were bigger and better with Chennai folks embracing the festival and making it their own. The number of local scripts performed in the festival outweighed the international scripts, and there were many Tamil plays also. The winner of this edition was “A Typist with Destiny”, directed by Rajiv Rajaram with Naveen George Thomas and Shravan Ramakrishnan in lead roles.

Artiste Profile

1. Mathivanan Rajendran

Mathivanan Rajendran is an Indian Film and Stage Actor and Director and a Media Producer. He is the Founder of Stray Factory a Performance Arts and Digital Media company based out of Chennai. He is known for his work in Mayakkam Enna and Sawaari. He is also the co-founder of Rascalas an online platform for South Indian content. In 2016 he produced one of South India's first web series Black Sheep, a coming of age story of a college drop out.

His plays have been performed at festivals across the globe including National Arts Festival and Hollywood Fringe Festival. His notable plays include My Name is Cine-maa, Who is your Osama and Carpouram and feature his frequent collaborators Pooja Devariya and Venkatesh Harinathan. He studied automobile engineering in Sri Venkateswara College of Engineering, Chennai and holds a master's degree in Industrial Engineering from Virginia Tech.

Short+Sweet Theatre Festival Chennai 2014: Won Best Director for 'Carpouram'. The play was the runner-up for Best Play Award.

2. Rajiv Rajaram

Rajiv Rajaram, the standup comic, writer and partner at Stray Factory, has done many gigs in well-known comedy clubs across the world. Always the class clown and the entertainer in his family, Rajiv gave stand-up comedy a shot in 2013. Today, he is one of the brains behind Stray Factory's viral YouTube videos, including South of India. He is currently the Creative Director at Culture Machine.

Short+Sweet Theatre Festival Chennai 2014: Won Best Director and Scriptwriter for 'A Typist with Destiny'. The play also won the Mithran Devanesan Award for Best Production.

3. Pooja Devariya

Pooja joined the theatre group Stray Factory and has worked on stage performances and online videos with the company. During the production of the theatre show, Dirty Dancing, she was spotted by Gitanjali Selvaraghavan who recommended her to her husband, and the actress appeared in his Mayakkam Enna (2011) portraying Padmini, a friend in Dhanush's gang. In 2015, she was in production for six films, including roles in Karthik Subbaraj's Iraivi and Manikandan's Kuttrame Thandanai. As a model, she was on the cover of India Today magazine alongside actor Naren Weiss several times. Her directorial debut was also his play Maya from Madurai.
